Bassermann-Jordan	Ernst	1876-1932	He was a very important figure in horology collecting. By publishing in 1914 the first book on horology for collectors, he influenced the German-speaking collectors of clocks, watches and sun dials during the first half of the 20th century. He published an anthology of his essays including some about collecting and his collection. The books include photos of a small number of the antique timepieces he owned, more than 300 clocks and scientific instruments of great historical value.
